

Exhibit Properties

Exhibit Design & Fabrication

Average cost for new, custom construction:

Island: \$142 per sq. ft. Inline: \$1,182 per linear ft.

Editor's note: Using winning bid figures published over the last 2 years in EXHIBITOR's monthly "New Properties" column, we calculated an average cost of \$512 per square foot for island exhibits and \$145 per square foot for inline exhibits.

Refurbishment:

Crated: 15-20% of original price,

per year

Uncrated: 25-30% of original

price, per year

Taxes:

You'll pay tax on materials used to build your exhibit. In some states, including California, you're taxed on labor, too.

Rental:

Approximately 2/3 of the purchase price (for one-time use at a show).

Exhibit Storage

Average cost per cubic foot: 17¢

Cost range per cubic foot: 5¢ to 30¢

Editor's Note: Some exhibit houses charge for unused space surrounding your crates and up to the ceiling. If you call them on it, sometimes they'll back off and charge only for the actual cubic feed your crates occupy.

Pull & Prep: Cost for the exhibit house to prepare your booth for shipment.
